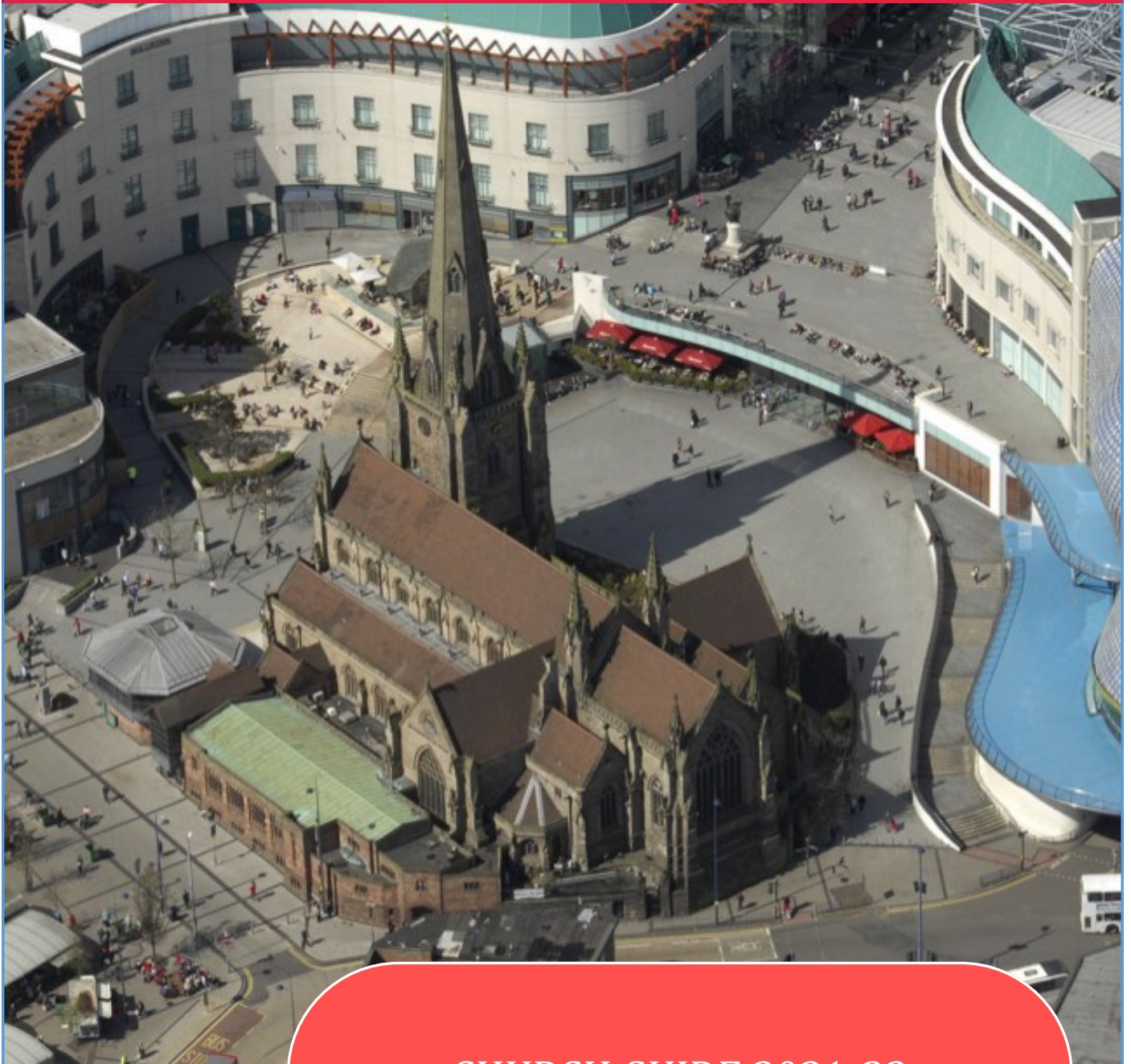

Why should church be an important part of your university experience?

The Christian Union is NOT a church

- The CU is a missional community that exists to give every student on campus a chance to hear and respond to the gospel of Jesus Christ so lacks the pastoral care required for spiritual growth
- The CU is student-led so lacks the wisdom of mature Christians
- The CU's beliefs are based on the UCCF doctrinal basis and teaching is based on evangelism to non-Christians so the CU doesn't give teaching on all aspects of how Christians should live out their lives
- **We believe it is more important that you join a local church than the CU. We'd love you to join both, but if you only have time for one of the two, please choose church.**

The bible tells us church is important

- Meeting with other Christians and being taught God's word is how we grow spiritually and its only when we have been built up in church community that we are able to develop the Christlikeness we require to reach non-Christians
- Church provides us with guidance, wisdom and accountability from older more mature Christians, not just students
- The spiritual discipline practiced by regularly attending church at university are a good indication of those you will keep later in life.

Visit them over the first few weeks of term.

Decide on a church to grow in and be part of.

Top Tips for Finding a Church

- Ask your home church leaders if they can recommend one - it may well be that they know a good church or have some contacts for you.
- Try a couple of different churches - and not necessarily just what you're used to - but try not to keep church-hopping. Choose one to settle at.
- Don't be put off by just one service - especially if it's not one of their normal ones - try the church at other times too.
- Don't look for the perfect church - many people never settle in church because they are looking for a church which doesn't exist - just find somewhere which is faithful to the Bible, focused on the gospel and welcoming, and stick with it, even if it's not exactly how you would like it!

Questions to ask of a church

- Is the church faithful to the gospel of Jesus Christ and does it teach the Bible? (Titus 1:9)
- Do the church leaders submit themselves to God's word? (Titus 1:7-9)
- Is there genuine concern among believers to spur one another on in their faith? (Hebrews 10:24-25)
- Is the church obviously a Christian community where people love one another? (1 John 3:11-18)
- Can I imagine feeling at home here and getting involved with the life of the church?
- Is it somewhere I could bring a friend?

The BCEC is a Chinese-heritage church that has been in Birmingham for over 25 years. Our church, has three language congregations, with a great mixture of families, undergraduate and post-graduate students, and young working adults. It's a place where many students have been able to make deeper connections, grow in their personal relationship with God, and be challenged to see the world with fresh perspective. Our church is welcoming to all people, and has British Born Chinese, people from Malaysia, Singapore, HK, China, Taiwan, and other parts of the world.

Every Sunday we have 5 services, covering English, Cantonese and Mandarin.
We also have different University focused ministries throughout the week.

English Service — 09:30 and 18:30

The English Speaking Ministry at the BCEC has a range of families, young working adults, university students, and youth. Our 9:30 service has our children's ministry, and our evening service has a more relaxed vibe to it. Our University ministry, CORE, meets on Wednesday evenings.

Cantonese Service — 11:30 & 13:30

Our 11:30 Cantonese language service has a children's ministry, and there's a second service at 13:30. There has been real growth with many new HK immigrants joining our services. It is a welcome place, especially for those from HK who are adjusting to life in the UK.

Mandarin Service — 15:30

Our Mandarin language service starts at 3:30 and is a combination of families and students from China. It's a great place to find community for those who have come over from China or Taiwan, and prefer worshipping in Mandarin.
